The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. Twenty four members were in attendance.

Flea Market – Green wristbands will be worn by club members as well as anyone who enters our flea market. If a club member notices a person without a wristband, please ask that person to go to the gate or the registration table to get a wristband. The wristband does not enter the guests into the drawings. They have to fill out an entry form at the registration table. Nineteen vendors preregistered so far, using twenty seven spaces. Everything is set at the fairgrounds. They have received the insurance policy. The Hampton Inn in Freeport gave us two \$99 coupons. They were given away to two vendors, one couple is from Nacussa, Wisconsin and the other coupon was given to a vendor from Waukesha, Wisconsin. We gave gate passes to the Fairfield Inn for our flea market and two gate passes were given away at the Wild Goose Run.

Brauer's could use help Friday before the flea market at 11:00 a.m. to help load the rest of the items into the trailer. We need help at the Fairgrounds by 9:00 on Saturday morning.

Saturday morning we need help to clean the kitchen, unload the van and prepare food. The club will provide lunch for you. After lunch we begin preparing supper for customers. If you have a 30 cup coffee pot, please bring it. If you have roasters please bring them too. Please label these items so we return them to the proper person.

You must wear a hat if you are working in the kitchen. We provide an apron and gloves. Take off the apron and gloves when you go to the bathroom. When you return to the kitchen, wash your hands again (in the hand-washing sink) and put the apron and gloves back on. Dry your hands with paper towels. If you serve food, the serving utensils stay in the food. Don't touch the food with your bare hands. Buckets with bleach water and sponges are available in the kitchen - use these to clean up counters, spills etc. If washing dishes, let them air dry. The club has to pay for any cases of food or pop that are opened.

Sunday 10:30-1:30 is the busiest time in the kitchen. From noon on the trailer and van can be loaded. The trailer has to be unloaded at Brauer's house on Sunday night.

There is a form for our club members to fill out if they are going to sell an item at the consignment table.

There will be a sheet at the consignment table with club member information that we need you to check for accuracy.

Flea Market is publicized on Craigslist.

We need gas blowers for Sunday clean up. Be careful when picking up tables, wear gloves and be careful not to hurt your back.

Club ERC – there may be two spots available. Check in at 7:00 a.m. The class should be done by mid-afternoon. Jeff has to turn in all registration fees and paperwork to NIU by next week.
